A report on the exercise undertaken by the Jammu and Kashmir Juvenile Justice Committee pursuant to the direction dated 20.09.2019 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in writ petition (Civil) No.1166/2019, titled Enakshi Ganguly & anr v. Union of India & ors., with regard to the facts stated therein.

1. On 20.09.2019, the Hon'ble Supreme Court was pleased to pass a direction in the aforesaid writ petition, *inter alia*, to the following effect:

"As the issues highlighted pertain to alleged detention of children, we direct the Juvenile Justice Committee of the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir to undertake an exercise with regard to the facts stated in the writ petition and revert to us within a week from today."

When the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court was brought to the notice of the Committee, it immediately convened a meeting on 23.09.2019 and resolved to ascertain facts from the concerned



State agencies as to the assertions and allegations made, in the writ petition in question, based on media reports. The Committee also decided to obtain data from the courts subordinate to the High Court of J&K, and the Registrars Judicial of the two wings of the High Court about the bail applications or Habeas Corpus Petitions, if any, moved on behalf of Juveniles or where it was claimed that the arrested person(s) or the detainees were juveniles, and the processes undertaken therein. The Committee further resolved to seek information in this regard from the Mission Director (ICPS), J&K, Srinagar. A copy of the minutes of the meeting of the Committee held on 23.09.2019 is appended to this report as annexure 'A'. It may be mentioned here that, as decided and resolved by the Committee in the aforesaid meeting, the Director General of Police, J&K, and the Divisional Commissioners of Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh, were directed to obtain separately reports/information on each and every assertion / allegation made in the petition and the media reports from their field agencies and to submit the same to the Committee through the Registrar General, High Court of J&K by 1 O'clock on 24.09.2019. However, on 24.09.2019, the authorities sought time to do the needful which, by resolution dated 24.09.2019 of the Committee, was allowed till 25.09.2019. A copy of the resolution dated 24.09.2019 is appended hereto as annexure 'B'

2. Pursuant to the aforesaid directions made by the Committee, the Additional Director General of Police (Cord.)

communication no.Legal/SCvide his PHQ, Srinagar, 25.09.2019 submitted a report, 23/III/2019/57413 dated addressed to the Registrar General of the High Court of J&K. The aforesaid report in original alongwith its enclosure - the list of juveniles in conflict with law - apprehended with effect from 05.08.2019, is appended hereto as annexure 'C'. The Divisional communication Commissioner, Kashmir, vide his DivCom/ARA-EG/70/2019 dated 25.09.2019 endorsed the aforesaid report submitted by the Police Headquarters. The said communication forms annexure 'D' hereto.

3. In its aforesaid report, the Director General of Police has categorically refuted the assertions and allegations made in the media reports and, consequently, in the writ petition. More specifically, it has been stated in the aforesaid report as under:

"Eversince the historic decision regarding abrogation of Article 370 was taken, it was necessitated to take immediate preventive measures in order to protect life and property of the people and avoid any problem that could breach the peace and public tranquillity, same, was strictly taken in consonance with the law of the land. However, in connection with children whosoever was found in conflict with law, same was strictly dealt (with) in consonance (with) the provisions of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children Act (2013)

[State Act] and strict directions have been provided from time to time to deal with the children strictly in accordance with the provisions of the relevant Act. The averments hence surfaced in the petition have been wrongly reflected in the petition and stand devoid of merits.

kept or taken into illegal detention by the Police authorities as strict adherence is placed on the provisions of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act. The State has appointed an officer of the rank of ADGP as nodal officer for implementation of the Act. At District level an officer has been nominated for the purpose and it has been ensured that at every Police Station level a juvenile police officer has been designated. As and when any report in respect of a juvenile in conflict with law is received, the said juvenile is dealt strictly as per the prescribed law on the subject."

Apart from stating the above, the Director General of Police, in its aforesaid report, has categorically denied the specific allegations made in the writ petition in the following manner:

"1. The specific allegations made in the petition have not been corroborated from the information received from the field formations. The individual

case where it is alleged that in violation of law the juveniles have been picked up by the Police and lodged in the Police lockups have been found not factually true. It is nothing but facts having been imagined from thin air submitted before the Hon'ble Court.

- 2. The reported incident of an 11 year old from Pampore having been detained is not factually correct. The authenticity of the reportage is quite doubtful. It seems that this report has been generated with the intention to malign the police and to create the story which may have element of sensationalism.
- Srinagar, upon enquiry, was also found to be without basis. The area falling under police station Soura had witnessed substantial disturbance in which even minors were found to be involved. However, nothing of the sort as alleged had taken place. The report carried out by Washington Post does not indicate the source which has quoted this incident so as to check the veracity of this information. So far the report submitted in this regard does not substantiate the alleged facts of the incident reported in the petition.
- 4. The third incident quoted in the petition titled 'Night Fill us with Dread' reported from Baramulla

carried by 'the Quint' dated 26.08.2019 appears to have been solely based on fictional imagination. A report received from the concerned district has denied that such an incident has taken place. It appears very strange that International Print Media and online news portals could carry this false report but not the local media.

- 5. Mehjoor Nagar Incident: On 22.08.2019 P/S Rajbagh picked up two individuals namely Muhammad Younis Rah and Shabir Ahmad Rah sons of Ali Muhammad Rah R/O Mehjoor Nagar Srinagar who were involved in case FIR No.80/2019 U/S 147, 148, 336, 427, 341 RPC of P/S Rajbagh. The two boys were found to be involved in stone pelting and after proper counselling by the SHO, they were handed over to their parents on the same day.
- 6. Umarhair incident Momin and Omar: The incident reported in the TRT World on 29th August, 2019, which is alleged to have happened in Umarhair is again not corroborated by the field report sought in this connection as such accordingly denied.
- 7. The report carried by Washington post on 30th August, 2019 about two boys namely Farhan and Junaid is again based on wrong reporting and has not provided the specifics of the alleged incident. It is

,

difficult, almost impossible, to enquire and seek report in an alleged incident like this.

- 8. The incident reported in Scroll on 28th August, 2019 is on the face of itself negating one. Not even a wee bit of credibility is inspired by it. The report suggests as if police is a predator on a prowl because it defies common sense that if a boy is on his way to hospital with tea and food carried by him, that he would be arrested and put behind the bars. This is nothing but an attempt to demoralize the police.
- 9. Regarding the arrest of 12 year old boy at Eidgah on 17th August 2019, it is emphatically denied that such an arrest was made. It happens often that when minor / juveniles indulge in stone pelting that they are momentarily held up on the spot and sent home. Some of these incidents are exaggerated beyond proportions and inimical elements often give flight to their febrile imagination.
- 10. The report carried by Washington Post on 30th August, 2019 about a 17 year boy Danish having been whisked away after police men jumped over the wall is again lacking details, therefore, the police is handicapped in responding to it in an effective manner. Since, essential facts have not been given for

the police to respond to it, hence it cannot be responded effectively.

- Caravan on 16th August, 2019 seems highly improbable because the report itself states that one CRPF personnel was talking to the uncle of the injured girl and, in the meanwhile, another CRPF personnel catapulted a stone which hit the girl in her eye causing injuries to her. It appears to be against the common sense because the stone could well have hit the CRPF jawan talking to the uncle of the injured girl. The most probable explanation for the injury is that the girl was hit by a stone thrown by some stone pelter, if at all such injury had occurred.
- 12. Asif Muhammad: As per field verification conducted, no such report has surfaced or based on facts. The news reported in Washington Post on 9th August, 2019 is obviously false and baseless.
- 13. Osaib Altaf: The incident as reported has been found to be baseless as no such death has been reported to the police authorities as per verification report received from the field formations.
- 14. With respect to the assertions reflected in the petition regarding making of arrests in Pulwama,

Pampore, Tral, Awantipora and Khrew, it is to submit that the averments reflected in the petition are vehemently denied. It is only one juvenile in conflict Burhan-udnamely, with law. Din Hilal S/O Hilal Ahmad Bhat R/O Gulzarpora, Awantipora, who was apprehended on 09.08.2019 owing to his involvement in case FIR no.106/2019 U/S 147, 148, 332, 336, 341, 427 RPC of P/S Awantipora. The provision of Section 11 of JJ Act has been complied with in letter and spirit. The juvenile was apprehended in his own interest as it was apprehended that the said juvenile would fall in the company of violent mob and exposing himself to moral, physical and psychological danger. The said juvenile in conflict with law was immediately handed over to his parents on the same day. No large scale picking up of minors in the jurisdiction of above places was made and the allegations are purely concocted and motivated.

It is to further submit that averments made in the petition are totally baseless, fallacious and offer only a biased version, based on media reports that have no evidentiary value. The State machinery has been constantly upholding the rule of law and not a single juvenile in conflict with law has been illegally

detained. The procedure as envisaged under Juvinile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act is being followed in letter and spirit. If at all the juvenile in conflict with law has been subjected to custody, the same has been placed in Observation Home under the orders of respective Juvenile Justice Board. The said Observation Homes offer temporary accommodation for the juveniles in conflict with law which also act as reformatories where conducive atmosphere for their counselling and rehabilitation is in place. There have been cases wherein it is established by the investigating agencies that certain juveniles in conflict with law are involved in stone pelting, rioting and causing damage to the public and private property, it is only the procedure prescribed under the law that is being followed in such cases and clear instructions to that effect have been issued to subordinate police The child welfare committees are formations. effectively working in the State and the petition is only an exaggeration to settle some political score and to demoralize the State action which has only been within the parameters of law."

4. It may be mentioned here that the State has established two Observation Homes: one at Harwan, Srinagar, and the other at R. S. Pora, Jammu. The Mission Director, JKCPS, J&K, Srinagar, vide his communication no.SMD/CPS/PS/Sgr/2019/Camp/01



dated 24.09.2019 submitted the list of juveniles in conflict with law received in these Observation Homes since 05.08.2019. The communication alongwith its two enclosures comprising seven leaves is appended hereto as annexure 'E'. Perusal of the first enclosure with the communication depicts that in all 36 Juveniles in conflict with law were received at Observation Home Harwan, Srinagar, with effect from 05.08.2019 till 23.09.2019 out of whom 21 have been bailed out; whereas enquiries are going on with regard to the remaining 15. Similarly, at Observation Home R. S. Pora, Jammu, 10 juveniles in conflict with law were received out of whom 06 have been bailed out; whereas enquiry is going on with regard to the remaining 04.

- Petitions, challenging regular detention orders passed by District Magistrates against them under Public Safety Act, the detainees have claimed to be juveniles. Whenever such petitions come up before the different Benches of the Court, the Court is directing holding of enquiry to ascertain the factum of age, and, if the detainee is found to be juvenile, appropriate orders in accordance with law would follow. Photocopy of an order of the Court passed in one such petitions which was listed yesterday, i.e., on 25.09.2019, is enclosed herewith as annexure 'F'.
- 6. So far as this Committee is concerned, eversince its establishment, it has been taking the requisite steps to ensure that the provisions of the law concerning juveniles are effectively

implemented. The Committee also occasionally conducts inspections of the Observation Homes to ensure that the juveniles lodged there are provided appropriate lodgement, bedding, clothes, food, recreation facility, health care etc.

7. This report is directed to be forwarded to the Registrar General, High Court of J&K, who shall ensure its submission before the Hon'ble Supreme Court within time.

Minutes of the meeting of the Jammu and Kashmir Juvenile Justice Committee held under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey, at 1 PM on this the 23rd day of September, 2019 in the High Court Complex at Srinagar, commencing the exercise with regard to the facts stated in the writ petition (Civil) No.1166/2019, titled Enakshi Ganguly & anor v. Union of India & ors., in compliance of the direction dated 20.09.2019 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the aforesaid writ petition.

1. Copies of the Writ Petition (Civil) No.1166/2019, titled Enakshi Ganguly & anor v. Union of India & ors., along with its annexures and the orders dated 16.09.2019 and 20.09.2019 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the above writ petition were placed by the Registrar General, High Court of J&K, before the Chairman and the Members of the Committee at around 2 PM on Saturday, 21.09.2019. On receipt of the aforesaid documents, the Chairman of the Committee, keeping in view the importance and urgency involved in the matter, coupled with the fact that one of the Members of the Committee, namely, Hon'ble Mr. Justice

Sanjeev Kumar, was out of the State in Gauhati, in connection with attending the conference organised by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, immediately addressed a communication to the Registrar General requiring him to convene a meeting of the Committee on Monday, i.e., today.

2. This Committee perused the averments made in the writ petition together with the annexures appended thereto and the orders passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Insofar as this Committee is concerned, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its order dated 20.09.2019 has directed as under:

"As the issues highlighted pertain to alleged detention of children, we direct the Juvenile Justice Committee of the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir to undertake an exercise with regard to the facts stated in the writ petition and revert to us within a week from today."

The aforesaid writ petition is reportedly next listed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court on Friday, 30.09.2019. Given the time allowed to this Committee, as aforesaid, the matter involves urgency.

- 3. There are numerous assertions made in the petition, based on media reports print and electronic alleging arrests, detention, beating and maining of juveniles etc. in the Valley of Kashmir ever since 05.08.2019.
- 4. At the outset, this Committee wishes to bring it on record that it or any of its Members individually has not received any complaint or representation or anything like that from any individual, lawyer, human rights' activist, group of persons, organization, Civil Society Member or any other person complaining about the arrest of any juvenile, though regular Habeas Corpus Petitions challenging arrests and detentions have continuously been filed before the High Court

by Advocates and, reportedly, bail applications for release of persons arrested by Police involved in different offences have also been presented before and dealt with by the Courts subordinate to the High Court in the Valley. Nonetheless, since serious allegations are contained in the press reports as put forth in the writ petition, some mechanism needs to be evolved to verify these reports and then, if the same are, or any incident reported therein is, found to be true, further course of action within the competence of this Committee would be undertaken in accordance with the provisions of the relevant law.

- In this regard, the Committee is of the view that it would need 5. to obtain reports from the concerned agencies of the State, like the Police and the Divisional Administration, about the assertions made in the writ petition. The Committee is of the view that it would be apposite to direct the Director General of Police J&K, and the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh, to separately obtain reports/information on each and every assertion / allegation made in the petition and the media reports from their field agencies, like Police Stations /Executive Magistrates (Tehsildars), and to submit the same to this Committee through the Registrar General High Court of J&K by 1 O'clock of Tuesday, 24.09.2019. To enable the authorities / officers to do the needful, copies of these minutes alongwith copies of the writ petition together with its annexures shall be forwarded to them today itself. In this regard, the Registrar General shall personally contact the Director General of Police and the Divisional Commissioners requesting them to depute some responsible officers of their offices to collect these documents from him for their further action, as aforesaid.
- 6. Further, the Committee is also of the view that it would be in the fitness of things to collect information from all the Courts of the State subordinate to the High Court as well as from the Registry of

this Court as to whether there has been any bail application or Habeas Corpus Petition, as the case may be, filed on behalf of a juvenile or where it is claimed or complained that the arrested person or detainee was or is a juvenile. This information shall also be called for by 1 O'Clock of Wednesday, 24.09.2019. The Registrar General, High Court of J&K, shall put in all efforts to ensure that this information is collected from the Principal District and Sessions Judges of the State who in turn shall collect such information from the courts subordinate to them / Remand Magistrates in their respective Districts. Furthermore, the Registrar General shall ask all the Principal District and Sessions Judges of the State to obtain information from the Juvenile Justice Boards within their jurisdiction as to whether any juvenile in conflict with law has been produced before or dealt with by them with effect from 05.08.2019 till date.

- 7. The Committee is also of the view that it would be befitting to obtain a report from the Mission Director (ICPS), J&K Srinagar Social Welfare Department, J&K, in his capacity as being the implementing Agency of integrated Child protection Scheme whether any juvenile, within his knowledge, has been arrested detained, beaten or maimed by the Police or security forces with effect from 05.08.2019 till date or any such instance or juvenile in conflict with law has been brought to his notice. The Registrar General shall obtain this information from the officer by the same time and date as aforesaid.
- 8. On receipt of the reports / information on the aforesaid lines, this Committee would be in a position to, and would, submit its report to the Hon'ble Supreme Court, and take further course of action as by law enjoined upon it.



9. This Committee resolves accordingly. Copy of these minutes/resolutions is ordered to be sent immediately to the Registrar General for further action at his end. This Committee shall meet again at 1 O'clock on Tuesday, 24,09.2019.

Subject:- Report in terms of Resolution dated 23.09.2019 of Hon'ble Juvenile Justice Committee High Court of J&K pursuant to the directions passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the writ petition (Civil) No. 1166/2019, titled Enakshi Ganguly & Anr Vs Union of India and Ors.

Sir,

Kindly refer to your office letter No. 16970-73/RG dated 23.09.2019 regarding the subject cited above, whereby information/report to each and every assertion/allegation made in the above titled writ petition was sought.

In this regard it is submitted that the petitioners claim to have information of instances where it is alleged that child rights as envisaged under Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of children), Act are being violated with impunity by law enforcing agency. At the first instance it is submitted that the averments reflected in petition are based upon hearsay and haphazard media reports, without any specific evidences/detailed assertions regarding the factual matrix wherever such assertion/incidences have been reported. The instances as quoted and claimed by the petitioners regarding arrest / detaining of children in different areas of Kashmir Zone cannot be independently verified or confirmed given the consideration of the facts reflected in the petition. The answering respondent is also not aware of any of these transgressions which the petitioners have submitted in the petition.

The petitioners have painted a very grim picture for the purpose of effect only. The ground situation as is prevailing since past more than one month due to historical decision taken by the Union Government bearing on the constitutional relationship between the State

of Jammu and Kashmir and Union of India is not a routine one passing of innocuously without ruffling feathers of the vested interests who provoke the public and vulnerable children to take law in their own hands and indulge in agitation by whipping up passion of the people. It is to submit that the children being prone to such malicious propaganda without understanding the consequences of indulging in violent activities are being used as shield by some vested interests.

Ever since the historic decision regarding abrogation of Article 370 was taken, it was necessitated to take immediate preventive measures in order to protect life and property of the people and avoid any problem that could breach the peace and public tranquillity, same was strictly taken in consonance with the law of the land. However, in connection with children whosoever was found in conflict with law, same was strictly dealt in accordance the provisions of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act and strict directions have been provided from time to time to deal with the children strictly in accordance with the provisions of the relevant Act. The averments hence surfaced in the petition have been wrongly reflected in the petition and stand devoid of merits.

It is pertinent to state that no child has been kept or taken into illegal detention by the Police authorities as strict adherence is placed on the provisions of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act. The state has appointed an officer of the rank of ADGP as nodal officer for implementation of the Act. At District level an officer has been nominated for the purpose and it has been ensured that at every Police station level a juvenile police officer has been designated. As and when any report in respect of a juvenile in conflict with law is received, the said juvenile is dealt strictly as per the prescribed law on the subject.

In light of the above quoted writ petition, the allegations/averments reflected in the petition were got verified from respective districts on the strength of which the below mentioned reply is submitted.



- 1. The specific allegations made in the petition have not been corroborated from the information received from the field formations. The individual case where it is alleged that in violation of law the juveniles have been picked up by the police and lodged in the police lockups have been found not factually true. It is nothing but facts having being imagined from thin air submitted before this Hon'ble court.
- 2. The reported incident of an 11 year old from Pampore having been detained is not factually correct. The authenticity of the reportage is quite doubtful. It seems that this report has been generated with the intention to malign the police and to create the story which may have element of sensationalism.
- 3. The incident alleged to have happened in Soura Srinagar, upon enquiry was also found to be without basis. The area falling under police station Soura had witnessed substantial disturbance in which even minors were found to be involved. However, nothing of the sort as alleged had taken place. The report carried out by Washington Post does not indicate the source which has quoted this incident so as to check the veracity of this information. So far the report submitted in this regard does not substantiate the alleged facts of the incident reported in the petition.
- 4. The third incident quoted in the petition titled "Night Fill us with Dread" reported from Baramulla carried by "The Quint" dated 26-08-2019 appears to have been solely based on fictional imagination. A report received from concerned district has denied that such an incident has taken place. It appears very strange that International Print Media and online news portals could carry this false report but not the local media.
- 5. Mehjoor Nagar Incident:- On 22-08-2019 P/S Rajbagh picked up two individuals namely Muhammad Younis Rah and Shabir Ahmad Rah Sons of Ali Muhammad Rah R/O Mehjoor Nagar Srinagar who were involved in case FIR NO. 80/2019 U/S 147,148,336,427,341 RPC of P/S Rajbagh. The two boys were found to be involved in stone pelting and after proper counselling by the SHO, they were handed over to their parents on the same day.
- 6. Umarhair incident Momin and Omar:- The incident reported in the TRT World on 29th August 2019 which is alleged to have

happened in Umarhair is again not corroborated by the field report sought in this connection as such accordingly denied. .

- The report carried by Washington Post on 30th August 2019 about two boys namely Farhan and Junaid is again based on wrong reporting and has not provided the specifics of the alleged incident. It is difficult, almost impossible to enquire and seek report in an alleged incident like this.
- 8. The incident reported in Scroll is again on 28th August 2019 is on the face of itself negating one. Not even a wee-bit of credibility is inspired by it. The report suggests as if police is a predator on a prowl because it defies common sense that if a boy is on his way to hospital with tea and food carried by him, that he would be arrested and put behind the bars. This is nothing but an attempt to demoralise the police.
- 9. Regarding the arrest of 12 year old boy at Eidgah on 17th August 2019, it is empathetically denied that such an arrest was made. It happens often that when minor / juveniles include in stone pelting that they are momentarily held up on the spot and sent home. Some of these incidents are exaggerated beyond proportions and inimical elements often give flight to their febrile imagination.
- 10. The report carried by Washington Post on 30th August 2019 about a 17 year boy Danish having been whisked away after policemen jumped over the wall is again lacking details, therefore the police is handicapped in responding to it in an effective manner. Since, essential facts have not been given for the police to respond to it, hence it cannot be responded effectively.
- 11. The news item carried by the Magazine Caravan on 16th August 2019 seems highly improbable because the report itself states that one CRPF personnel was talking to the uncle of the injured girl and in the meanwhile another CRPF personnel catapulted a stone which hit the girl in her eye causing injures to her. It appears to be against the common sense because the stone could well have hit the CRPF Jawan talking to the uncle of injured girl. The most probable explanation for the injury is that the girl was hit by a stone thrown by some stone pelters, if at all such injury had occurred.
- 12. Asif Muhammad:- As per field verification conducted, no such report has surfaced or based on facts. The news reported in



Washington Post on 9th August 2019 is obviously false and baseless.

- 13. Osaib Altaf:- The incident as reported has been found to be baseless as no such death has been reported to the police authorities as per verification report received from the field formations.
- With respect of the assertions reflected in the petition regarding 14. making of arrests in Pulwama, Pampore, Tral, Awantipora and Khrew, it is to submit that the averments reflected in the petition are vehemently denied. It is only one juvenile in conflict with law namely Burhan-Ud-Din Hilal S/Q Hilal Ahmad Bhat R/O Gulzarpora Awantipora who was apprehended on 09-08-2019 owing to his U/S involvement in case FIR No. 106/2019 147,148,332,336,341,427 RPC of P/S Awantipora. The provisions of section 11 of JJ Act have been complied with in letter and spirit. The juvenile was apprehended in his own interest as it was apprehended that the said juvenile would fall in the company of violent mob and exposing himself to moral, physical and psychological danger. The said juvenile in conflict with law was immediately handed over to his parents on the same day. No large scale picking up of minors in the jurisdiction of above places was made and the allegations are purely concocted and motivated.

It is to further submit that averments made in the petition are totally baseless, fallacious and offer only a biased version based on media reports that have no evidentiary value. The State machinery has been constantly upholding the rule of law and not a single juvenile in conflict with law has been illegally detained. The procedure as envisaged under Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act is being followed in letter and spirit. If at all the juvenile in conflict with law has been subject to custody, the same has been placed in observation home under the orders of respective Juvenile Justice Board. The said observation homes offer temporary accommodation for the juveniles in conflict with law which also act as reformatories where conducive atmosphere for their counselling and rehabilitation is in place. There have been cases wherein it is established by the investigating agencies that certain juveniles in conflict with law are involved in stone pelting,

rioting and causing damage to the public and private property, it is only the procedure prescribed under the law that is being followed in such cases and clear instructions to that effect have been issued to subordinate police formations. The Child Welfare Committees are effectively working in the State and the petition is only an exaggeration to settle some political score and to demoralize the State action which has only been within the perimeters of law.

Further the details of Juveniles apprehended under different provisions of law since 05-08-2019 in the State is annexed as Annexure A for kind perusal and appropriate course of action.







ORDER

- 1. This Heabus Corpus petition has been filed by applicant namely Umer Bashir Naikoo through his brother-in-law, challenges the detention order no. 25/DMS/PSA/2019 dated 10.08.2019, purporting to have been passed by District Magistrate, Srinagar, which is pending decision before the Court.
- 2. The applicant-petitioner has filed the instant application seeking a direction for shifting of detenu namely Umer Bashir Naikoo s/o late Bashir Ahmad Naikoo R/o Memender, District Shopian to Juvenile Observation Home, claiming the benefit of Juvenility on the strength of age as recorded 16th March 2005 in the "Maktabia Islamia High School, Shopian Kashmir".
- 3. The claim is made on the strength of photo copy of certificate issued by Principal Maktabia Islamia High School, Shopian on 30.08.2019 under serial no. 126, certifying that the Date of Birth of detenu namely Umer Bashir Naikoo S/o Late Bashir Ahmad Naikoo R/o Memender District Shopian is 16th March 2005. Certificate further mentions that the detenu was enrolled in the institution from 2011 to 2014 and read upto 5th class.
- 4. When this matter was taken up on motion hearing on 28th August, 2019, the Court while registering the claim made in the petition asked the State counsel Mr. B.A Dar, Sr. AAG to file response by or before 4th Sept.



2019. Response stands filed by District Magistrate, Shopian, indicating therein that the detenu was admitted in the School on 01.03.2012 vide admission no. 823 in class 3rd and at the time of admission no certificate of birth was produced by the parents of applicant-detenu nor the school administration bothered to procure/demand the same from the concerned offices viz Chowkidar, Municipality or Hospital. However, the brother of the detenu furnished an affidavit mentioning the date of birth of the applicant-detenu as 16.03.2005, and school administration has already issued the certificate to this extent. The District Magistrate's response further indicates that many mutilations were notice in the recorded Date of Birth of many candidates from the Admission Registrar of the School.

- Since in the instant case, the claim of Juvenility has been raised in 5. terms of Section 8 of the Jammu and Kashmir Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2013 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 2013), an enquiry is required to be made to determine the age of applicantdetenu as on the date of the detention. The Apex Court in case "Abuzar Hussain v State of W.B,(2012) 10 SCC 489" and "Shah Nawaz v State of UP., (2011) 13 SCC 751" had recorded it's satisfaction that the entry relating to the date of birth entered in the marks sheet is one of the valid proof of evidence for determination of age of an accused person. However, it is further revealed from the portion of the judgment in paragraphs (23) & (24), that the certificate had been proved by the statement of the Clerk of the concerned School and corroborated by other documents. The certificate produced in this application in proof of the date of birth of the applicantdetenu is neither the original document nor attested by any person, much less an authorized person, therefore, cannot be taken as conclusively establishing the date of birth of the applicant-detenu.
- 6. In the aforesaid circumstances and to meet the ends of justice, it is provided as under:
 - hold an enquiry and take such evidence as may be necessary (but not an affidavit) to determine the age of applicant-detenu namely Umer Bashir Naikoo s/o late Bashir Ahmad Naikoo R/o Memendar, District Shopian, as nearly as may be, on the date of the alleged detention, dated on 10.08.2019.



- The Registrar Judicial shall complete such enquiry within a period of 10 days from today and submit the report in sealed cover.
- iii) Registry to list the main WP (C) 299/2019 together with the present application for arguments and consideration before the Court on 14th Oct. 2019.
- iv) Learned counsel for the parties shall ensure full cooperation as required by the Registrar Judicial during the enquiry enabling her to frame her report.
- v) Registrar Judicial shall have all powers to summon the parties in terms of the High Court Rules and Civil Procedure Code.
- vi) Copy of the order be furnished to learned counsel for the parties.
